## Confessions

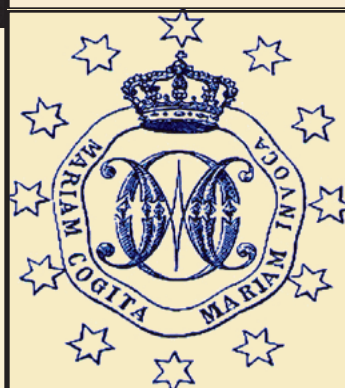
Our weekday confessions continue at our normal times:

## A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

### Think of Mary, Call on Mary

Every church, diocese, and religious order has a titular feast – the feast of the principal patron for which it is named. The titular feast of Holy Ghost Church is Pentecost Sunday, and that of the Oblates of the Virgin Mary is the Holy Name of Mary, September 12.

Pope Innocent XI added this feast to the Church's universal calendar in 1683. On September 12 that year, the siege of Vienna by Muslim Turks was broken and the miraculous victory was attributed to calling on the name of Mary. According to the Catholic Encyclopedia, "We venerate the name of Mary because it belongs to her who is the Mother of God, the holiest of creatures, the Queen of heaven and earth, the Mother of Mercy. The object of the feast is the Holy Virgin bearing the name of Miryam (Mary); the feast commemorates all the privileges given to Mary by God and all the graces we have received through her intercession and mediation."

Venerable Bruno Lanteri had a special filial love for Mary throughout his life and founded the Oblates in her name. He said, "the Congregation of the Oblates is not my work, but the work of Mary Most Holy... She is its foundress, its mother, and its teacher." Our motto is from the Office of Readings of the feast, from a sermon on the Name of Mary by St. Bernard:

*In dangers, in hardships, in every doubt, think of Mary, call out to Mary. Following her, you will never go astray. Asking her help, you will never despair. Keeping her in your thoughts, you will never stumble. With her protection, you will not be afraid. With her leading you, you will never tire. Her kindness will see you through to the end. Then you will know by your own experience how true it is that "the Virgin's name was Mary."*

#### PARKING LOT INSTRUCTIONS

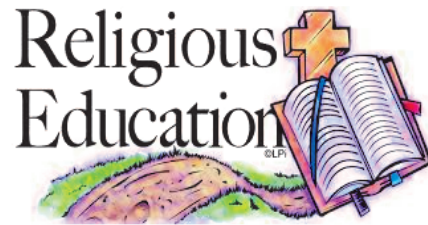
Location: 19th & Welton

Parking privileges end on: Saturday – 8:00pm  
Sunday – 6:45pm

Go to the KIOSK and:

- 1) Touch any key on the key pad
- 2) **License plate. Put in your license plate letters and digits...PRESS OK**
- 3) Kiosk will then ask you to choose time. Press #4 for Holy Ghost...PRESS OK
- 4) Screen Prompts Enter Code...
- 5) Enter **1312**...PRESS OK
- 6) Kiosk prints out dashboard ticket.

**Put the ticket inside your car on the dashboard face up!**

## Resuming the Public Celebration of the Holy Mass \*(Phase One)

\*(Please note that this resumption will occur over a period of time and in different phases, informed by Archdiocesan guidelines and instructions. This is **not** a return to normal schedules or procedures.)

### Preliminary information:

The Sunday obligation is lifted for all Catholics.

Parishioners who are ill in any way...cough, fever, colds, should not attend Mass. Parishioners who are elderly or who have any pre-existing health difficulties should not attend Mass yet.

In accord with current public health recommendations, the faithful should wear cloth face coverings when in public, including when they come to church.

Parishioners should use hand sanitizing stations as they enter and exit the church.

Communicants must receive the Eucharist on the hand and maintain the six-foot separation guidelines.

Clearly marked stations will be set up throughout the church. These stations are places parishioners put themselves as a single person...a couple...or a family...when the stations for a Mass are filled, no other parishioners will be allowed to enter.

There will be one entrance in...and one entrance for exit...

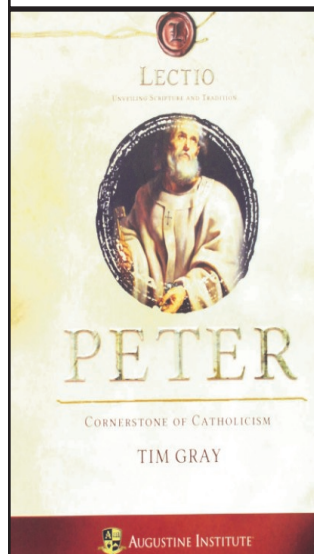

## Holy Land Collection

September 12-13, 2020

The annual Pontifical Good Friday Collection did not happen during the normal time of Good Friday this year due to COVID-19 and has been rescheduled to take place as a second collection during the weekend of September 12-13. The collection for the Holy Land is a universal collection.

The collection sustains Christianity in the Holy Land. With your support, the Franciscans maintain the sacred shrines throughout the Holy Land so that pilgrims can walk in the footsteps of Jesus.

In addition, the Franciscan friars minister in parishes, provide formation and education, build homes, provide jobs, take care of the elderly, and feed the hungry. And in times of war and instability, they provide humanitarian aid. The Pontifical Good Friday Collection adds to the “universal” dimension of our faith.
