## **WEEKLY REFLECTION**

This weekend we are happy to celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe!

Today's feast was instituted almost a century ago, in 1925, by Pope Pius XI. This was a tumultuous time in world history, as empires were rapidly falling and being replaced by hyper-liberal states. The Mexican Revolution, which lasted from 1910-1920, led to the formation of an anticlerical and anti-Catholic secular government under the country's 1917 Constitution. The 1917 Russian Revolution saw the rise of Bolshevik Communism under Vladimir Lenin, and the creation of the Soviet Union. Similar revolutions swept through Germany, Austria-Hungary, the Ottoman Empire, and many other nations, leading to either Communism or fascism. Governments became increasingly radical and anti-Christian, erasing religious liberty and asserting themselves as temporal sovereigns over and above the influence of the Church.

It was in the midst of this political upheaval that Pius XI boldly declared that Jesus Christ is King, now and forever. Every king and every legislative body on earth must answer to Him, and no society will achieve its goals for temporal peace apart from Him. "When once men recognize, both in private and in public life, that Christ is King, society will at last receive the great blessings of real liberty, well-ordered discipline, peace and harmony." (19)

And yet, our Lord is not a tyrant. He rules not with the iron fist of war, revolution, and oppression; but with gentleness, humility, and selfless service. He is the King who "came to serve, not to be served." (Mt 20:28) For us, this a model for how we are to lead, govern, and serve, each in our own lives and spheres of influence. It is also an invitation to rest in His leadership, and not lose hope because of the tribulations of our world today. "Oh, what happiness would be ours if all men, individuals, families, and nations, would but let themselves be governed by Christ!" (20)

Catechesis Corner When the first reading of this celebration speaks of that kingdom, it does so to recall that Jesus of Nazareth was of the line of King David, but also, and above all, to emphasize that the royalty proper to Christ is of a different kind. The words which Mary heard at the Annunciation are significant: "The Lord God will give to him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob for ever; and of his kingdom there will be no end" (Lk 1:32-33). This kingdom, then, is not only the earthly kingdom of David, which came to an end. It is the Kingdom of Christ, which will never end, the eternal Kingdom, the Kingdom of truth, of love and of eternal life. (from Pope John Paul II's November 22, 1998 homily)

#### 100 Year Anniversary Indulgence

Holy Ghost Church

On December 14, 2024, we commemorate 100 years since the dedication of the lower church at this location, in what is now our parish hall. 19 years later, the present church was completed and dedicated. We have received a partial indulgence designation (protocol number 2024-0611 AB A) for noon December 7-29, 2024

under the following conditions: once on any day that you come to Holy Ghost and receive Communion and also pray for the intentions of our Holy Father and the Archbishop of Denver, and go to confession during the period of the indulgence, you can receive a partial indulgence for yourself or souls in purgatory. An indulgence does not forgive sins, it removes temporal punishment due to our sins. A partial indulgence can be earned every day of the period.

We will acknowledge this anniversary during the Mother Teresa Social Ministry Christmas Party on the day (December 14), and also at the parish Advent retreat on December 21, during which we will lead everyone in the prayers to receive the indulgence that day (confessions will be offered, and the Masses before and after the retreat would count).
