WEEKLY REFLECTION

Last weekend I had the great joy of leading a retreat for young adults at Annunciation Heights! 17 people braved the cold and the snow to spend the weekend in the mountains, away from the busy -ness and noise of city life, in order to slow down and reconnect with the living God on a deeper level.

The program of the retreat was simple: the *kerygma*. "Kerygma" is a fancy Greek word that refers to the essential message of the Gospel, that fundamental dynamic of salvation history. Acts XXIX summarizes this with four words: Created, captured, rescued, redeemed. St. Ignatius of Loyola, in his Spiritual Exercises, takes the retreatants through the same basic movement. His Principle and Foundation expresses our fundamental identity and purpose in Christ, rooted in our creation; the "First Week" (first section of the Exercises) allows the retreatant to pray with the themes of sin and mercy, how we are fallen and then redeemed by Christ; and the "Call of the King" meditation invites the retreatant to make a response of his/her own in gratitude for these gifts.

This same dynamic can even be found in the Sacraments of the Church. In Baptism, we are re-created, and given a new identity in Christ: children of God the Father, members of the Body of Christ, and Temples of the Holy Spirit. The Sacrament of Reconciliation allows us to confess our sins, to repent, and to experience God's infinite mercy. Confirmation and the Eucharist give us the strength to respond generously to God, to make a choice for how we are to know, love, and serve Him.

This was the essence of the retreat last weekend: the expression of the kerygma through St. Ignatius and the Sacraments of the Church. If you'd like to pray through these themes on your own, here are the Scripture passages we used:

Creation, identity, purpose: Psalm 139; Matthew 3:13-17 Sin, mercy: Psalm 51; Luke 15:11-32; John 8:1-11

My response: Luke 5:1-11; John 15:12-17


