WEEKLY REFLECTION

It's New Years' resolution time! Or maybe that time has already come and gone for some of you... you tried committing to something new, it lasted a few days, and now you've fallen off the wagon. A very common scenario. In any case, I thought I'd share a couple of tips that I find helpful in making any kind of new resolution.

- 1. Don't overcommit yourself. This is one that many people struggle with, including myself. I was recently evaluating how I spend my time and how I'd like to manage that better. So I wrote down an "ideal day" with how much time I'd like to spend on work, prayer, leisure, etc.: 12 hours for work, 3 for prayer, 2 for meals and hygiene, 2 for leisure, 1 for exercise, 7 for sleep. If you add those up, you'll find that my ideal day is 27 hours long! Obviously, that is not sustainable; something has to give. I need to readjust how I commit my time so that I don't overcommit in this coming year. When making resolutions, remember that there are only 24 hours in a day, and try not to overcommit yourself.
- 2. Make monthly resolutions. Instead of making some really big resolutions for 2025, try making smaller, incremental resolutions on a month-by-month basis. It's much easier to commit to a change for 30 days, as opposed to 365. I have found this helpful to stick with my proposals and resolutions, and the compounded effects of monthly resolutions can indeed add up very quickly!
- 3. Pray about it! When deciding what to do for 2025, or even for the month of January, don't try to make that decision alone. Ask the Lord for His guidance; bring Jesus into the picture. Discern the will of God, rather than making it all about yourself. He can help you to keep first things first, and to order all other aspects of your life to those that are truly (and eternally) important.

Hopefully these tips help you in making New Years' resolutions that are truly helpful and sustainable!


Weekend and Weekday Masses & Church Functions Location: 19th & Welton ("Lighthouse Lot")
