WEEKLY REFLECTION

Ordo Amoris

This past week, we've seen something quite unprecedented: a theological debate between the Vice President of the United States and the Pope. The debate revolved around the concept of the "Ordo Amoris"—the order of love—and how it applies to the Trump administration's immigration policies and the press surrounding them.

Christian love (also called *agape* or charity) demands that we love everyone with the unconditional love of Jesus Christ. "This is my commandment: love one another as I love you." (John 15:12) There are no exceptions to this commandment. However, on a practical level, it is simply impractical to express this love for every human being equally, and so it is necessary to have an order of love. We love God first, then self, then family, then friends, then community, then nation, then the world. In deciding how to spend our energies, we keep this order: show love first to those who are closest to us, and second to those are far off. Vance is correct in expressing the Ordo Amoris in this way, and calling out the misguided compassion of some. It is often easier to love humanity in the abstract, to love those who are far away, because "mankind" makes no demands on us personally. To love the person in front of you, however, requires very concrete action and often sacrifice; this love must come first.

Where Vance falls short in his theology is in the foundation of the Ordo Amoris: universal love for all. In his letter to the US Bishops, Pope Francis writes, "The true ordo amoris that must be promoted is that which we discover by meditating constantly on the parable of the 'Good Samaritan' (cf. Lk 10:25-37), that is, by meditating on the love that builds a fraternity open to all, without exception." Prioritizing love of those closest to us on a practical level must never entail doing evil to those who are far off. The true order of love precludes all hate, and all offenses against the dignity of the human person. The Holy Father, along with many US Bishops, sees the mass deportation program as an affront to the dignity of its victims. "The act of deporting people who in many cases have left their own land for reasons of extreme poverty, insecurity, exploitation, persecution or serious deterioration of the environment, damages the dignity of many men and women, and of entire families, and places them in a state of particular vulnerability and defenselessness.'

We are allowed to have our own opinions on matters of practical politics. But we should listen to voices of our shepherds here, and let our consciences be formed in a way that truly loves and respects the dignity of all.

Catechesis Corner

A pyx is a small round container used to carry the Eucharist to the sick unable to come to a church in order to receive Holy Communion. The term "pyx" usually denotes a small, flat, clamshell-style container, often about the size of a pocket watch and usually made of brass or other metals, traditionally lined with gold.



A fabric or leather pouch for carrying a pyx is known as a burse. Typically, this kind of burse can be securely closed and is fixed with cords so that the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of Holy Communion can affix it to his or her person during transport to prevent the consecrated host(s) from being accidentally lost.


