WEEKLY REFLECTION

The Annunciation

I have a few unpopular opinions. For example: 20 below zero isn't that bad without the wind (yes, I'm Minnesotan). Guitar Masses can be very reverent and beautiful (very controversial with certain "trad" Catholics). Nutella tastes great with cream cheese. And don't even get me started on politics. But here's one that you probably haven't heard before: The Solemnity of the Annunciation (which the Church celebrates this week on March 25) should be a Holy Day of Obligation.

What?! Why?! Why add more days of obligation to what the Church already asks of us? The simple answer is that it's important! The Annunciation coincides with the beginning of the Incarnation, the very moment when Christ our Lord took on human flesh in the womb of the Virgin Mary. After Christ's death and resurrection, this is the most important moment in all of human history—before his nativity and his ascension, before the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, before the Immaculate Conception or the Assumption of Mary. Salvation began when the Son of God descended from his eternal glory in heaven to his lowly throne in the Virgin's womb. And (in my opinion) we ought to honor that historical event with the same devotion and liturgical dignity that we give to the other great feasts of the Church: the Immaculate Conception, Christmas, Mary the Mother of God, the Assumption, and All Saints, all of which are Holy Days of Obligation.

Now the Church is undoubtedly wiser than I am, and there is good reason not to make Mass attendance on the Annunciation obligatory for all Catholics. But if I can, I encourage each of you to celebrate this glorious feast day, and the incredible event it commemorates, with as much solemnity as possible. Go to Mass, have a nice dinner, give to the poor, pray the rosary as a family! There are many ways to celebrate. Whatever you choose to do, celebrate the glory of this day as one of the greatest feasts in the whole liturgical year, and as one of the most significant events in all of human history.

Happy Solemnity of the Annunciation!


