

WEEKLY REFLECTION

WELKEI KEI EECHO

Isaiah foretold the Messiah as Prince of Peace. Jesus said he came not to bring peace but the sword. At the same time, the Kingdom of Heaven that is "already upon you" is a place of charity—selfless love—that is contagious like the grain of yeast that makes a whole batch of dough rise!

This week's tragic attacks on Catholic institutions mark, by one person's count, over 500 violent acts against Catholic institutions in the United States since 2020. And around the world, priests, sisters, and children at church and church schools or orphanages have been kidnapped or killed seemingly without hesitation or conscience.

What do we make of this? What is safety and security?

At the end of the day, what we do for safety and security only mitigates the full harm that could be done, and healthcare only mitigates the shortness and pain of life to a finite degree. There are no guarantees this side of heaven, except that there is a God, and that our lives on this earth will come to an end.

We have to say that anyone who commits an objectively destructive act resulting in loss of life, limb, or property, was out of line. We do not know the person's heart, even with a mountain of evidence as to the person's intentions, and we can always pray that the good that was present in that person from the beginning of life would endure into eternity and fully glorify God in heaven, by His own grace.

This week, our hearts are touched with sorrow and compassion toward those grieving the loss of innocents. We long to each be at our best, and that it would overflow to all around us. This troubled world needs us in Eucharistic adoration, needs our families practicing the faith, needs conscientious voters and community organizers applying ourselves to seek the common good. This way, the outlying thoughts would feel very strange indeed.

May we all allow the Lord to deepen our conversion, and call us all together toward our heavenly homeland!

Catechesis Corner

A deeper meaning of today's parable makes us think of the position of the human being in relation to God. The "lowest place" can in fact represent the condition of humanity degraded by sin, a condition from which the Incarnation of the Only-Begotten Son alone can raise it. For this reason Christ himself "took the lowest place in the world the Cross and by this radical humility he redeemed us and constantly comes to our aid" (Encyclical Deus Caritas Est, n. 35). Let us look to Christ as a model of humility and of giving freely: let us learn from him patience in temptation, meekness in offence, obedience to God in suffering, in the hope that the One who has invited us will say to us: "Friend, go up higher" (cf. Lk 14: 10). Indeed, the true good is being close to him. St. Louis IX, King of France whose Memorial was last Wednesday put into practice what is written in the Book of Sirach: "The greater you are, the more you must humble yourself; so you will find favor in the sight of the Lord" (3: 18). This is what the King wrote in his "Spiritual Testament to his son": "If the Lord grant you some prosperity, not only must you humbly thank him but take care not to become worse by boasting or in any other way, make sure, that is, that you do not come into conflict with God or offend him with his own gifts" (cf. Acta Sanctorum Augusti 5 [1868], 546). (from Pope Benedict XVI's homily on August 29, 2010)




Introduction to Christian Spirituality
