WEEKLY REFLECTION

A Church of Missionary Disciples

Are we growing or remaining stagnant? This is an important concept in business—if you're not growing, you're dying, or so they say. We always have to cultivate a growth mindset, rather than just a 'maintenance' or 'status quo' mindset, if we don't want to stagnate.

The same question presents itself to the Church. Are we growing or dying? Do we have a growth mindset or a maintenance mindset? It is very easy to fall into the latter, where we do just the bare minimum: Show up to Mass on Sunday, throw \$20 in the basket, then forget about Jesus for the next 167 hours. In this maintenance mindset, we just care about checking the boxes, and have little to no personal relationship with Jesus, and no zeal for inviting others to experience something profound in the Church.

A growth mindset, in the context of the Catholic faith, is rooted in conversion and evangelization. Each of us must first experience is deep and total initial conversion, by which we definitively choose to follow Christ as his disciple. Then, after deciding to follow Jesus, we must follow him into mission, sharing his message with those around us and working for the advancement of his Kingdom. By doing this, we become missionary disciples. Practically, this means stepping up: It can mean organizing a Bible study at your office, becoming an OCIA sponsor for someone becoming Catholic, teaching catechism to first graders, dedicating your time and resources to serving the poor, or even just making time for prayer every day.

We need more missionary disciples in our Church. We need them right here, at Holy Ghost. We need faithful Catholics who are so filled with the love of Christ that they will take that message and run with it! This is how we adopt a growth mindset in church and in our parish community: by having a church full of disciples and evangelists. Because we can't always expect someone else to do the job. This invitation is personal: We need YOU to be a missionary disciple!

Catechesis Corner In addition to their military and spiritual roles, Biblical judges held judicial authority, serving as arbiters within the community, resolving disputes and ensuring that the laws given to Moses were upheld. This judicial function helped maintain social order and provided a sense of stability in a time when centralized governance was absent. The judges' ability to interpret and enforce the law was essential for the cohesion of the Israelite tribes, often scattered and divided. Sirach 35: "For he is a God of justice, who knows no favorites. ... The prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds; it does not rest till it reaches its goal, nor will it withdraw till the Highest responds, judges justly and affirms the right."

Life Around the World Report

We had a wonderful turnout for international food and lots of people in the room, phenomenal sponsors, wonderful volunteers, and a very strong showing in the auctions. We raised \$12,000 that night for our Respect Life ministries! This is nearly triple what has been typical for us. The committee will decide how to apply these funds to ministries in our area, including partnering with the Knights of Columbus to obtain an ultrasound machine for a local crisis pregnancy clinic.
