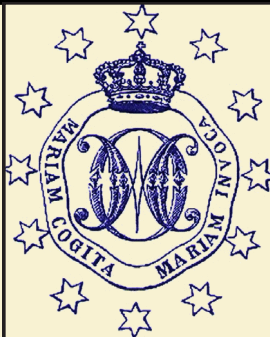

WEEKLY REFLECTION

Peace on Earth

...might not be possible.

Or so we are often tempted to concede.

It's a full moon again, folks. Downtown life has been crazy the last few days. Shouting, smashing, driving crazy. Then news breaks from overseas of invasions, assassinations, disasters, and Saturday morning's news of the forcible extraction of a sitting head of state by our military. Things might be just as turbulent in your family.

When we see how far things can fall apart, we have two routes to take: hope and despair. In the Latin languages, these words are more closely related, such as in Spanish: *Esperanza* and *Desesperanza*.

In the times into which Jesus was born and in which the thinktanks to the East pondered the signs in the stars and the world over, our ancestors held a similar longing for a lasting resolution to the turbulence they lived, ever threatening despair. And so the Star and the revelation of God in the Flesh that it signified broke into that darkness to give more than a glimmer of hope. The peace we long for here will certainly be given in heaven to those faithful to the end. But in the adoration of the shepherds and of the wise men from the East, as well as the worship of the angels and the animals, we find a foreshadowing of that harmony.

It is for us today to embody those kernels of peace with Hope. We must be the peacemakers who remind those around us that it is possible and that it is worth striving for. Even suffering for.

It would be so good to learn from the Magi how to commit, with good discernment, to what our God stands for, in the midst of many threats and voices to the contrary, that is, Our God's Peace and Joy. This Epiphany and in this New Year, may that Peace and Joy reign over all the earth!

Catechesis Corner Bethlehem, meaning "House of Bread" in Hebrew, is a town located about six miles south of Jerusalem in the Judean hill country. Bethlehem first appears in the Bible in connection with Rachel, Jacob's wife, who died and was buried on the way to Ephrath, which is Bethlehem. It is also the setting for the Book of Ruth, where Ruth gleaned in the fields of Boaz, leading to her marriage and becoming the great-grandmother of King David.



Bethlehem is the birthplace of David, Israel's second king, who was anointed by the prophet Samuel in this town. This connection establishes Bethlehem as the "City of David."

The prophet Micah foretold that Bethlehem would be the birthplace of a ruler in Israel, whose origins are from ancient times: "But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come forth for Me one to be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times."

The Gospel of Matthew records the visit of the Magi, who, guided by a star, came to worship the newborn King in Bethlehem.

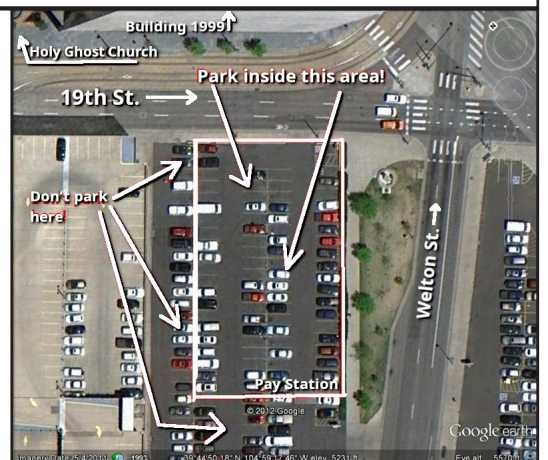

You may stop by the parish office M-Th 9-5 or mail or email your requests to the office. The standard Mass offering is \$10, but it is entirely up to you whether to offer any amount at the time you make your request.

Collective Mass Intentions Beginning in January 2026, the first Sunday noon Mass of each month will be available for a *collective intention*. This means multiple intentions can be requested for the same Mass, with the knowledge that the Mass will be offered for all of them. This new practice is in accord with a Decree from the Dicastery for the Clergy dated April 13, 2025.

St. Michael prayer

Beginning on New Year's Eve, we have begun praying the St. Michael prayer after all Masses. This popular prayer invokes the power of the archangel who leads the good angels in battle over the forces of Satan, and in the present age, his intercession and intervention are so needed. It is important to note that this is a communal devotion observed *after* Mass, not part of the Mass. We know so many of you have this devotion, and we will now observe it together.
