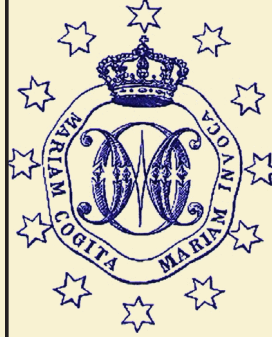

What’s Going on with the SSPX?

Last Wednesday, June 1, the Society of St. Pius X (SSPX)—a traditionalist group dedicated to restoring the pre-Vatican II Church—consecrated four new bishops, without papal mandate and against the express desire of the Pope. The Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith (DDF) responded the next day with a letter stating everyone involved in the illicit consecration did in fact incur the latae sententiae excommunication on account of the sin and crime of schism. The document stated further that any Mass celebrated by an SSPX priest is illicit and does not fulfill one’s Sunday obligation, and that marriages and confessions officiated by them are invalid.

The SSPX denies the validity of the excommunication, believing their actions were justified. They believe the modern Church of Rome is in crisis and has fallen into apostasy, and that their actions are necessary to safeguard the deposit of holy tradition. However, through this belief they deny what is essential to the Church—her enduring holiness founded on Christ’s promise to Peter—thereby placing themselves outside of full communion.

What does this all mean for us? First, it is a warning and a wake up call to the SSPX and other traditionalist Catholics. Anyone is free to prefer the Tridentine Latin Mass, but you can’t call the Church apostate and still say you’re Catholic. While excommunication does not condemn anyone to hell, it does clearly state that the SSPX is now outside the full visible communion of the Catholic Church, essentially in the same boat as any Protestant denomination. This is a dangerous place to be, and anyone who is in that position is urged to seek reconciliation with Rome immediately.

Secondly, this is a call for all of us to pray for and foster unity in the Church. The Pope is the visible representation of this unity: Whoever stays with him can rest assured that they are in Christ’s Church, and whoever sets up another magisterial authority over him places himself outside the full communion of the Catholic Church. We need to pray for our brothers and sisters who are understandably shaken by these recent developments, and welcome them warmly into full communion with Rome, while uniting ourselves wholeheartedly to the truth of our faith and its visible expression in our parish communities.

Catechesis Corner Pope Francis on Meekness

Jesus reprimands these two Apostles, James and John, because in a Samaritan village they wanted fire to come down from heaven upon those who did not want to receive him. The two apostles felt that to close the door on Jesus was a great offense and that these people needed to be punished. But the Lord turned and rebuked them: “This is not our spirit.” The Lord always goes ahead, making the way of a Christian known to us. It is not a path of revenge.

The Church, as Benedict XVI has told us, grows by attraction, by witness. And when people see this witness of humility, meekness and docility, they feel the need which the prophet Zechariah spoke of, saying: “Let us go with you.” Faced with the witness of charity, people feel this need. Charity is simple: worshipping God and serving others. This is the witness that makes the Church grow.

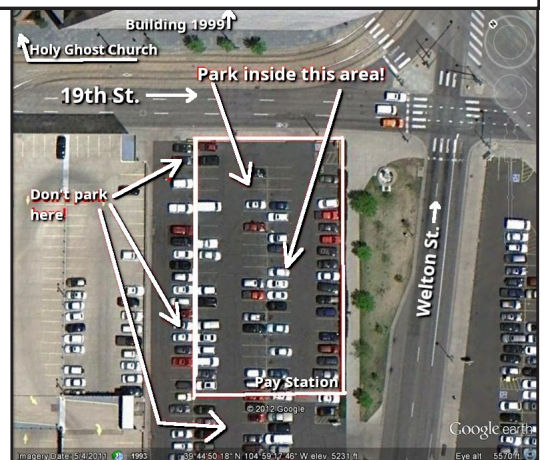
